



Duke, who graduated from SUNY Broome with two Associate's degrees in 2017, worked closely with Greg Diller, Cortland's transfer mobility advisor, starting in 2016. He helped answer questions about multiple issues including housing, and kept in touch while Duke formulated her future plans.

They met about four times to make sure everything was on track, and they still keep in touch to make

sure everything is going well.

"It's really nice to know that someone cares about how it's going with all the new experiences," said Duke, now a junior Sports Management major interested in event management.

Now in its second year, the Path to Cortland program helps students plan their futures. Students - who don't have to be committed to SUNY Cortland, or near graduation - can schedule an appointment with Diller, the visiting expert on topics ranging from course recommendations to financial aid, student life and support services.
